
# Hygiene Supply Drive

# Rock Steady Boxing

- Rock Steady is a boxing program that holds classes on campus geared towards individuals with Parkinson Disease and other movement disorders.
- Goal is to improve quality of life through a non-contact boxing based fitness curriculum.
- Classes held In-Person on Monday,
  Wednesday and Fridays on a Weekly basis



### Community Free Clinic

- The NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine Community Free Clinic is a local clinic run by physician and student volunteers who provide medical care to those in need who may no be able to afford care
- Goal is to improve access to healthcare in the NY and Long Island Region
- Clinics are held in Central Islip, Old Westbury and Harlem, NY
- Office visits are offered both in person and virtually via televisit
- **Update:** The clinic in Old Westbury most recently added a separate clinic that solely provides free Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine to those in need. This project came to fruition in October 2022.

## Mentorship Program

- Partnered with Gold Humanism Honor Society to establish a mentorship-like program
- Recruited newly-matched fourth-year students to serve as mentors to current third-years/rising fourth-years
- Provided breakdown of students by specialty with their contact information for questions regarding fourth-year and the residency application process
- Made available to student body via email due to COVID-19
- Will continue for the 2023-2024 academic year




#### Blood Drive and Be The Match
